THE TAYLOR FIELD SALE AND CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOL AUTHORIZATION BYLAW, 2005 (NO. 2)

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REGINA ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

Statutory authority

1 The authority for this Bylaw is section 8 of *The Cities Act* and section 14 of *The Alcohol and Gaming Regulations*, 2013. (#2016-48, s. 18(2), 2016)

Definitions

- 2 In this Bylaw:
 - (a) "Beverage Alcohol" has the same meaning as is in *The Alcohol and Gaming Regulations Act*, 1997;
 - (a.1) **'City Manager'** means the person appointed to the position of City Manager of the City or his or her designate;
 - (b) "Home Game" means all sanctioned Canadian Football League, Canadian Interuniversity Sport and Prairie Football Conference exhibition, regular season and playoff games;
 - (c) "Special Event" means all exhibitions, promotions, entertainment, performances, or athletic competitions (excluding Home Games) at which the sale and consumption of beverage alcohol is proposed, conducted with the prior approval of the City Manager or his or her designate;

Sale of Beverage Alcohol

- Beverage Alcohol may be sold and consumed at Taylor Field:
 - (a) at any Special Event, provided that there shall be no more than six Special Events during any calendar year; and

(b) by or on behalf of the Saskatchewan Roughrider Football Club, the University of Regina Rams or the Regina Thunder Football Club at any Home Game;

upon those terms and conditions set by the Liquor and Gaming Authority for the Province of Saskatchewan.

Authorization

The City Manager or his or her designate is authorized to consider and in his or her judgment approve or deny applications for Special Events. (#2009-71, s. 23, 2009; #2011-64, s. 18, 2011, #2016-48, s. 18(4), 2016)

Repeal
