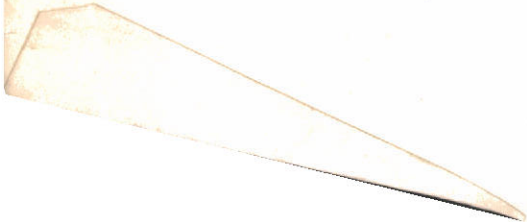

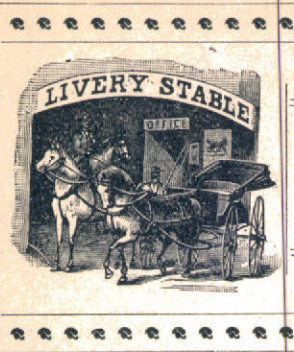

Your fire water and Light Committee
to submit the following report Re the
present Communications referred to them at a
previous meeting of the Council

Re Mr. J. C. McLaughlin's application asking the
Council to take such proceedings as would lead
an inspection of his Building on Scarth Street
was partially destroyed by fire and asking
necessary instructions to enable him to
proceed with repairs.

Having made a thorough inspection of his
Building and find that the damages on same do
not exceed the amount specified in By Law
No (211) Section (11), we have therefore come to the
Conclusion that we have no Power to prohibit
Mr. McLaughlin from repairing his Building. But
such repairs must be ^{done} in accordance with Section
(11) of By Law No. (211) which says, "That in making
such repairs or restoration, no part of said building
shall when so repaired or restored, be of or reach
a height greater than the highest part of the
original Building."

Another communication was referred to us from
George A. Montgomery of a similar nature as
the above. But as the Committee have been informed
from a reliable source that the Property have since
changed hands, and that the "Purchaser" have fully
decided to erect a building on the lots in question
in accordance with the By Law now in force
