Teaser: Changes on the City Hall Courtyard



This morning, you may have noticed a change taking place in front of City Hall, on the Queen Elizabeth II Courtyard. The I Love Regina structure, installed in 2004 to celebrate community pride, is being removed. It's not because the I Love Regina campaign is coming to a close. In fact, it's just the opposite.

I Love Regina was initiated in 2002 by the Office of the Mayor. In coming days, watch for a public announcement of the I Love Regina 20th Anniversary event in Victoria Park this August.




So, we may be saying farewell to a familiar sight at City Hall, but the spirit of I Love Regina remains alive and well. In the short term, we'll be planting flowers where the sign was previously placed, while longer term plans will continue to be discussed. As for the current sign, it'll be safely stored.

Hi Folks,

I took some pictures of the I love Regina sign on my way back in from lunch. According to my very cursory inspection it appears to be structurally intact. It is bolted down to roughly a 450mm wide (and who knows how deep) pile, then surrounded by a concrete pad. As you can see in the pictures the panels themselves have patches of missing paint, some surface rust, remnants of adhesives and much of the black paint that once highlighted the Regina logo has faded or chipped away. If you are planning a re-unveiling of this as part of the commemoration of the plaza, I think that you need to have it repainted. Relocating this sign to either of the proposed locations will require the services of a structural engineer to design a new pile or to assess the structural capabilities of the concrete area behind the stage.

Unfortunately this is not work that our branch has the capacity to lead at the moment. We suggest that you reach out _____.
